How to Convert Cross Stitch Pattern Sizes: A Step-by-Step Guide (200 x 200 Stitches)

When you get a cross stitch pattern, it usually lists the design size in stitches—like "Design size: 200 x 200 stitches." To figure out how big your finished project will be, you need to know the fabric count, which is the number of stitches per inch.

This guide walks you through converting that stitch count into actual dimensions using 14-count Aida fabric.

Understanding Fabric Count

Fabric count = number of stitches per inch.

So for 14-count Aida, there are 14 stitches in every inch.

Example Calculation for 200 x 200 Stitches on 14-Count Aida
Given:

Design size: 200 x 200 stitches

Fabric count: 14-count Aida

Steps:

Convert stitches to inches:

Width: $200 \div 14 = 14.29$ inches

Height: $200 \div 14 = 14.29$ inches

Convert inches to centimeters (1 inch = 2.54 cm):

Width: $14.29 \times 2.54 = 36.30$ cm

Height: $14.29 \times 2.54 = 36.30$ cm

Summary of Dimensions for 14-Count Aida

Width: 14.29 inches (36.30 cm)

Height: 14.29 inches (36.30 cm)
