How to Convert Cross Stitch Pattern Sizes: A Step-by-Step Guide (300 x 300 Stitches)

When a cross stitch pattern lists the design size as "300 x 300 stitches," you'll need to convert that to physical dimensions. To do that, you must know the fabric count—how many stitches fit into one inch.

This example uses 14-count Aida fabric, which is one of the most common types.

Understanding Fabric Count

Fabric count = stitches per inch.

On 14-count Aida, you'll fit 14 stitches in one inch.

Example Calculation for 300 x 300 Stitches on 14-Count Aida
Given:

Design size: 300 x 300 stitches

Fabric count: 14-count Aida

Steps:

Convert stitches to inches:

Width: $300 \div 14 = 21.43$ inches

Height: $300 \div 14 = 21.43$ inches

Convert inches to centimeters (1 inch = 2.54 cm):

Width: $21.43 \times 2.54 = 54.43$ cm

Height: $21.43 \times 2.54 = 54.43$ cm

Summary of Dimensions for 14-Count Aida

Width: 21.43 inches (54.43 cm)

Height: 21.43 inches (54.43 cm)

Conclusion

With a quick stitch-to-inch conversion based on fabric count, you'll know exactly how large your finished design will be. This helps you choose the right amount of fabric and the proper frame size.
