How to Convert Cross Stitch Pattern Sizes: A Step-by-Step Guide (71 x 100 Stitches)

When a pattern lists the design size as "71 x 100 stitches," you can figure out its real-world dimensions using the fabric count, which tells you how many stitches fit into one inch.

This example uses 14-count Aida fabric, a standard choice in cross stitch.

Understanding Fabric Count Fabric count = stitches per inch. 14-count Aida means 14 stitches fit in one inch.

Example Calculation for 71 x 100 Stitches on 14-Count Aida

Given:

Design size: 71 x 100 stitches

Fabric count: 14-count Aida

Steps:

Convert stitches to inches:

Width: $71 \div 14 = 5.07$ inches

Height: $100 \div 14 = 7.14$ inches

Convert inches to centimeters (1 inch = 2.54 cm):

Width: $5.07 \times 2.54 = 12.88$ cm

Height: $7.14 \times 2.54 = 18.14$ cm

Summary of Dimensions for 14-Count Aida

Width: 5.07 inches (12.88 cm)

Height: 7.14 inches (18.14 cm)

Conclusion

Once you know your fabric count, it's simple to calculate the actual size of your cross stitch design. Always leave extra fabric around the edges for framing or finishing.
